



Introducing hospital-based treatment with SOF/DAC


Set a tone for treatment decentralization

NSP & piloting decentralization with 25 PHC along with FIND


Go all out against all odds

Steep annual treatment expansion since decentralization




HCV Treatment Decentralization Model in Malaysia




Multi-Pronged Strategy of Malaysia to Drive Decentralization
